**RECOVERY LAW CENTER TO HOST FOOD DRIVE BENEFITTING
HAWAII FOODBANK ON FEB. 23**

HONOLULU (February 13, 2019) – In partnership with Hawaii Foodbank, Recovery Law Center will be encouraging community members to donate canned goods and non-perishable items at the firm’s upcoming food drive event on Saturday, February 23, 2019 from noon to 2 p.m.
